Sue Dyson is Reader in Nurse Education, Head of Nursing and Midwifery Research and Director of the Nursing and Midwifery Research Centre (NMRC) at De Montfort University. Sue's research is in three main areas: a) transcultural education, which is viewed as dialogic and interdisciplinary, and where students and teachers learn *with* others, b) the student experience, with particular reference to minority ethnic students and how they experience, strategise and negotiate work, life and study in unfamiliar environments, and c) the broader aspects of pedagogic research as nurse educators prepare to 'educate for uncertainty' in the 'new era' of health care provision.
